## Jackie Robinson

Jackie Robinson born on January 31, 1919, in Cairo, Georgia U.S. was the first African American to play Major League Baseball in the United States during the 20th century. On April 15, 1947, he broke the decades-old "colour line" of Major League Baseball when he appeared on the field for the National League Brooklyn Dodgers in a game against the Boston Braves. He played as an infielder and outfielder for the Dodgers from 1947 through 1956.

Robinson became an outstanding all-around athlete at Pasadena Junior College and the University of California, LA (UCLA). He excelled in football, basketball and track as well as baseball. In 1941 Robinson withdrew from UCLA in his third year to help his mother care for the family. To provide financial assistance, he began playing semi professional football in Hawaii while also working in construction. In 1942 he entered the U.S. Army and attended officer candidate school; he was commissioned a second lieutenant in 1943.

## Martin Luther King

Martin Luther King born January 15, 1929 in Atlanta Georgia.

was a Baptist minister and social activist who led the civil rights movement in the United States from the mid-1950s until his death by assassination in 1968. His leadership was fundamental to that movement's success in ending the legal segregation of African Americans in the South and other parts of the United States. King rose to national prominence as head of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference which promoted nonviolence tactics, such as the massive March on Washington (1963), to achieve civil rights. He was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964.

## Rosa Parks

Rosa Parks born February 4th, 1913 in Tuskegee, Alabama was an American civil rights activist whose refusal to give up her seat on a public bus precipitated the 1955–56 Montgomery bus boycott in Alabama, which became the spark that ignited the civil rights movement in the United States. She is known as the "mother of the civil rights movement."

*"People always say that I didn't give up my seat because I was tired, but that isn't true. I was not tired physically, or no more tired than I usually was at the end of a working day. I was not old, although some people have an image of me as being old then. I was forty-two. No, the only tired I was, was tired of giving in."*
