VII. PRESENTATION

1. <u>Connecting with School Communities about Suicide: Hope and Resilience in Southeast Alberta</u>

An update was presented regarding the work that has been done to date with community partners around the impact of grief and loss in our community.

Community partners including MHPSD, MHCBE, PRSD, CAPE School, Medicine Hat College, Medicine Hat Police Service, Redcliff RCMP and Southeast Alberta Child and Family Services, along with subject matter expert Kevin Cameron, came together to plan an event to connect with families. Knowing that the recent events in our community intensified the effects of COVID, the team planned to go ahead with a conversation with parents and staff to ensure that they feel that they have the support that they need to have conversations with their own children.

In preparation for the event, a survey was sent out to families. The results of that survey indicated that 76% of the 614 people surveyed have been personally affected by suicide and 32% didn't feel that they had the necessary tools and supports to assist with suicide, grief, loss and mental health conversations with family.

A School Community Conversation event took place at the Medicine Hat College on October 7th. There were 267 virtual live attendees and 85 individuals submitted questions prior to the presentation.

The questions generated 9 key themes, which were addressed during the presentation:

- 1. Concerns related to pandemic/school-closures and reopening.
- 2. When are my child's struggles serious enough to warrant the need for more help?
- 3. What are schools doing to address mental health and how do students access supports?
- 4. What community supports are available and how to access them?
- 5. How to have open conversations about suicide with your child/youth.
- 6. How do I help someone who isn't ready for help?
- 7. Understanding the grief process.
- 8. Impact of social media on children/youth.
- 9. Building resilience in our children/youth.

Councilors were available on-line following the event to provide an opportunity to get parents connected with available resources.

A follow-up survey was shared with attendees and of the 110 respondents, 95% reported that the information presented was applicable and useful for their family and 86% felt that they have a better understanding of the supports available to them through their local school or in the community.

The Community VTRA Protocol team will continue to provide opportunities for messaging around hope, resiliency and positive coping.

Mr. Sadlemyer reported that the Division has made a lot of strides across all categories and participation continues to increase from year to year. There have been gains in 6 out of the 10 categories, and the Division has moved from high to very high in the areas of Safe and Caring, Educational Quality and School Improvement. The results also show improved strength in 8 out of the 9 measured categories.

It was also noted that the results reflect what is happening in the schools through collaborative response, programming, work they are doing with Division assets and delivering on the commitment to families. The Division will continue to monitor data to ensure growth in lag measures.

2. Provincial and Diploma Examinations Update

An overview of the 2019/20 achievement test and diploma examination results is not available this fall as the June exams were cancelled due to COVID-19.

It was noted that the Minister recently announced that the writing of 30 level Diploma exams will be optional this fall. This poses a challenge for schools in determining how many exams to have available. A survey has been sent to students/families asking whether they intend to write these exams.
