

## **BYLAW NO. 2020-01**

## BEING A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH ELECTORAL BOUNDARIES FOR TRUSTEE GENERAL ELECTION and AUTHORITY FOR JOINT ELECTION

Pursuant to the provisions in the *Education Act, Statutes of Alberta, 2012* and *Local Authorities Election Act, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000*, and the amendments thereto, The Medicine Hat Public Board of Education, in the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

- In accordance with *Section 76* of the *Education Act*, The Medicine Hat Public Board of Education declares that:
  - (a) there shall be five (5) trustee positions, and
  - (b) the election will be by general vote of the electors within the municipal boundaries of the City of Medicine Hat.
- In accordance with Section 2 of the Local Authorities Election Act, the Board authorizes the following:
  - (a) Entering into an agreement to hold a joint election in conjunction with the City of Medicine Hat.
  - (b) The City of Medicine Hat's City Clerk to act as the Board's Returning Officer for the School Board Election on October 18, 2021.
  - (c) The City of Medicine Hat's Assistant City Clerk to act as the Board's Substitute Returning Officer for the School Board Election on October 18, 2021.
- This bylaw shall come into force and effect upon the date of the passing of the third and final reading.

Board Procedures Regulation – AR 82/2019:

- 6 (1) Every bylaw of a board must have 3 distinct separate readings before the bylaw is passed.
  - (2) Not more than 2 readings of a bylaw must be given at any 1 meeting unless the trustees present at the meeting unanimously agree to give the bylaw a 3<sup>rd</sup> reading.
  - (3) The first reading of a bylaw must be in full and, if each board member has in the member's possession a written, printed or electronic copy of the bylaw, the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> readings may be by title and description only.
