#### IV. PRESENTATION

#### 1. Instructional Coaching

Mrs. Carla Carrier, Director of Learning & Partnerships, highlighted how the **Continuum of Coaching**—which includes consulting, collaboration, and coaching—fosters a sustainable cycle of improvement. This shared framework offers multiple entry points, ensuring a meaningful and lasting impact.

She also presented data on the positive impact of our instructional coach model, residencies, and professional learning facilitation within the division. Data was collected by OLCs using a worksheet to track key criteria, informing planning for the current and upcoming years.

Key insights from the data:

- Increased Engagement: Coaching events per workday grew each month.
- Primary Support Areas: Initial OLC contacts were mostly for residencies and teacher-driven professional learning.
- Focus on Impactful Instruction: Teachers increasingly sought support for effective instruction, with 36% focusing on numeracy and 31% on literacy.
- **Defining Impactful Instruction:** This refers to the flexible and responsive application of universal and targeted strategies to meet evolving student needs.

## **Looking Ahead**

Plans to expand support into **secondary schools** include:

- **New Curriculum Rollout** for Grades 7-10 (piloting Math, Social Studies, PE, and Wellness).
- Transition Support for Grades 9-10.
- Broader Secondary Support initiatives.
- Grade 9 PAT Performance Focus as part of transition efforts.

Trustees and administrators provided overwhelmingly positive feedback on the program's success.
