#### VIII. PRESENTATIONS

#### 1. Congratulations to Division Students

Medicine Hat Public School Division is incredibly proud of Medicine Hat High School students Malak Ali and Fatema Riaz. Malak scored 100% on the Physics 30 Diploma Exam and Fatema scored 100% on the Biology 30 Diploma Exam.

Both students and their families were present to receive recognition of this accomplishment.

## 2. MHPSD Careers Team

Our team of off campus coordinator and work experience teachers will share with the board the work that is being done to support career education and opportunities across the grades in MHPSD.

Associate Superintendent Sadlemyer shared statistics highlighting that most students graduating from our high schools will not attend university. The work of this team is

focused on introducing kids, parents and teachers to career pathways available to our students.

Introducing students to potential careers in Grade 7 and earlier will help them explore and understand opportunities available. Students in Grade 9 will have time following their final exams to complete prerequisites required for the Work Experience program. Grade 10 students can pursue different pathways to introduce themselves to the trades and potential careers.

The team has been working to establish connections with post-secondary institutions and local businesses to provide opportunities and hands on training for students. Starting in Grade 10, students can enroll in the Registered Apprentice Program (RAP) and start accumulating hours towards becoming a Journeyman. Dual Credit programs allow students in high school to access to over 70 post-secondary courses at no fee. The courses award high school and post-secondary credits while exposing students to programs of interest to them.

#### 3. First Nation Métis and Inuit Team

The First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Team presented and highlighted a range of programs offered to MHPSD students, schools, and families. This includes the inaugural Kiskihkeyimowin week-long cultural event hosted at the Medicine Hat College. The FNMI team continues to share what they have learned and the successes observed with the broader educational community at multiple conferences. Together, we can advance Truth and Reconciliation through staff and student understanding of Indigenous perspectives and the application of foundational knowledge.

The FNMI team includes Darryl, Shirley, Courtney and Melanie who work with our schools directly. Since introduction of this program in 2018 the number of students identifying as FNMI has nearly doubled. The ratio of FNMI students graduating at both high schools has also increased drastically from last year. Students wanted representation of their culture during graduation ceremonies and a student suggested a beaded tassel or chord. Chords are made with glass beads by a group of elder women in the community, taking approximately 5 hours to make each one.

The team has made 36 classroom presentations that are based in curriculum and response from students is positive. In addition to presentations made in classrooms and conferences, the team hosted Emma Morrison, Miss Canada as a guest speaker at some of our schools. Kiskihkeyimowin, following its success last year, is scheduled for May 6-10 at Medicine Hat College with students in Grade 4 and 10 taking part.

Darryl shared his appreciation for the support that his team has received to make this program as successful as it is.

The Board expressed their admiration for this team and the amazing work they have done. Following this team's presentation at the Canadian School Board Association Conference in Banff members of the Board received glowing feedback from their peers. They appreciate the work being done in our schools to support students and their families.
