2. New Curriculum Update

An update in relation to the implementation of the new curriculum was provided to the Board.

Assistant Superintendent Peters provided an overview on the work currently in progress to ensure a successful curriculum implementation. The goal is to help teachers read and interpret the new curriculum so they can purposefully apply elements of the Optimal Learning Environment to their practice. This plan, focused around providing teacher clarity, learning intentions and success criteria, is a tool that can be used to help implement future curriculum changes.

Professional Learning (PL) around curriculum implementation began in May 2022 and will continue into 2023. PL feedback has been positive, particularly around days where teachers from each grade work collaboratively to review the changes and address challenges they have faced in their classrooms.
