Educational rationale for Europe Trip to France and Italy

Overview

This 10-day educational trip to France and Italy is designed to enrich the learning experience of Grade 11 and 12 students by providing them with direct exposure to historical, political, and cultural landmarks. The trip aligns with the Alberta Social Studies curriculum, particularly focusing on concepts related to nationalism, international relations, and historical perspectives.

Alignment with Curriculum

Social Studies 20-1 & 20-2: Nationalism

- **France:** Students will explore the historical significance of the French Revolution by visiting sites like the Palace of Versailles and Place de la Concorde. Museums such as the Louvre provide insights into revolutionary art and symbolism.
- **Italy:** A visit to Rome offers opportunities to study Italian unification, nationalism, and the role of cultural identity in shaping modern Italy.

Social Studies 30-1 & 30-2: Globalization and International Relations

- **France:** World War I and II memorials, provide a deep understanding of international conflict and cooperation.
- **Italy:** Students will engage with historical narratives by exploring the Colosseum, Roman Forum, and Vatican City, enhancing their understanding of imperialism and global influence.

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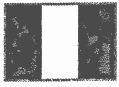

Petty crime

Petty crimes, such as pickpocketing and purse and mobile phone snatching, are common. Thieves often target tourists.

Petty crime occurs frequently on public transportation, particularly:

- the Paris metro
- Île-de-France regional express network (RER) lines linking the capital to its surroundings
- international rail routes such as Paris-Brussels-Amsterdam and Paris-London.

Thieves are very skilled. They often act in groups and regularly work with minors. They may use various techniques to divert your attention and steal your belongings.

Thieves are mainly active in large cities and busy places, such as:

- popular tourist sites
- department stores
- restaurants and patios
- hotel lobbies
- parks
- transport hubs

During your trip:

- keep your personal belongings, including your passport and other travel documents, in a secure place
- don't carry large sums of cash or valuables unnecessarily
- avoid walking alone after dark
- be aware of your surroundings, especially in busy tourist areas
- be extra cautious when withdrawing cash from ATMs

- Keep a photocopy of your passport in a safe place in case it's stolen

Violent crimes

Violent crimes are rarer, but still occur.

Tourists are sometimes victims of violent attacks by groups of young people who want to rob them. These attacks usually occur :

- around major tourist attractions
- near railway stations
- on trains of the Île-de-France regional express network (RER) connecting the capital to its surroundings

Assaults can also occur outside night-time establishments and in more isolated areas at night.

Italy

Petty crime

Petty crime, such as pickpocketing and bag snatching, occurs frequently. Thieves often target tourists.

Criminals may try to distract you and take your attention away from your valuables or belongings. Be cautious of distraction tactics, including people who:

- spill drinks on you or your belongings
- engage you in lengthy conversations
- persistently offer to assist you
- attempt to distance you from your personal belongings

Burglaries and home break-ins occur, including from holiday homes and rentals.

Theft is particularly common in crowded public areas such as:

- popular tourist areas and historical sites
- buses, trains, bus and train stations, and airports
- hotel lobbies
- restaurants, including outdoor seating areas
- beaches

During your trip:

- keep your personal belongings, including your passport and other travel documents, in a secure place
- do not show signs of affluence or wear expensive jewellery
- do not carry large sums of cash or valuables unnecessarily
- be aware of your surroundings, especially in busy tourist areas
- be wary of unsolicited offers or advice from strangers
- keep doors and windows locked when you are away

Vehicle theft and theft from parked vehicles occur. Thieves often target rental cars. Criminals on scooters or on foot often snatch bags and other valuables from pedestrians and from inside cars stopped at traffic lights.

If you plan on driving during your stay:

- keep your windows closed and car doors locked at all times
- keep bags and other valuables out of the reach of pedestrians
- never leave belongings unattended in a vehicle, even in the trunk

Sexual assault

Sexual assaults have occurred, including against foreign women.

The Italian Government operates 1522, a 24/7 public utility number with multilingual operators to respond to the needs of victims of gender-based violence and stalking.

If you are the victim of a sexual assault, you may report it immediately to the nearest Government of Canada office. You can also report the

assault to the police (Polizia di Stato) or seek medical attention by calling 112.

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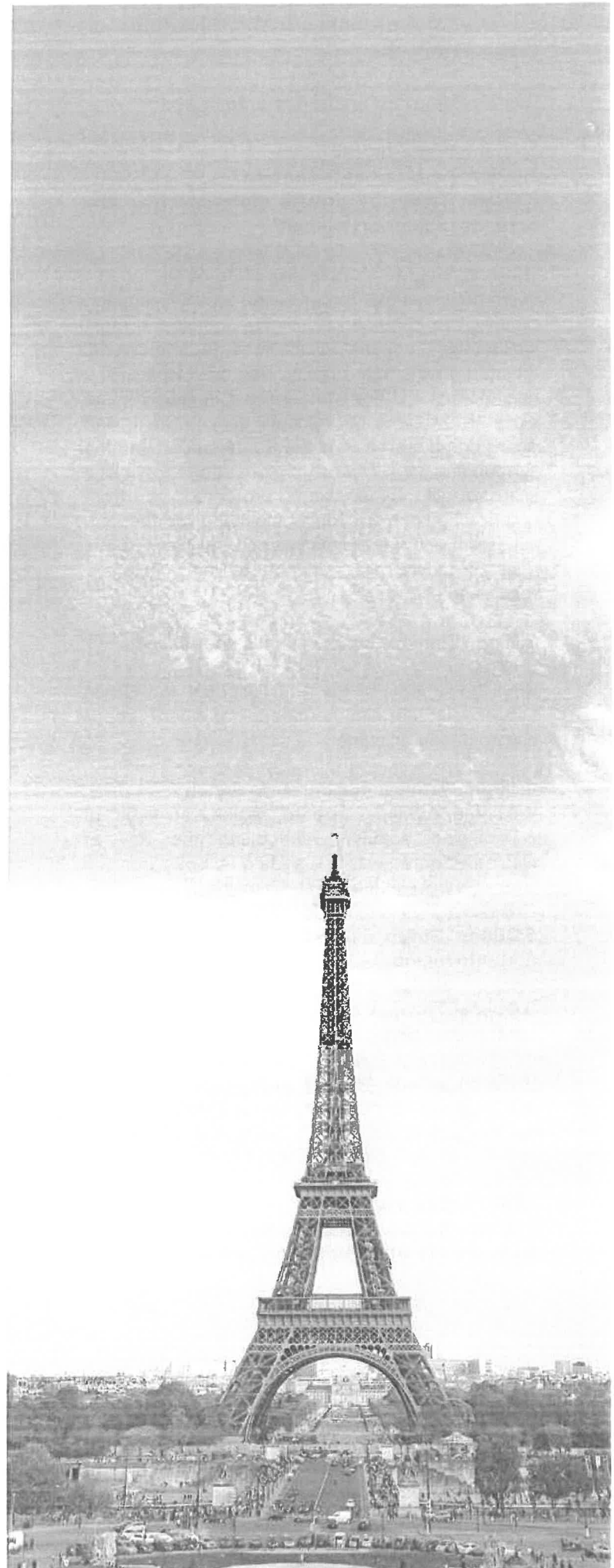

Learn how wealthy Romans lived 2,000 years ago on a visit to Pompeii, one of the richest and most well-known archaeological sites in the world. Situated along the breezy Bay of Naples, the neighboring Mt. Vesuvius erupted in A.D. 79 and close to 20 feet of volcanic ash, pumice, and debris completely buried the Roman resort and the surrounding area. The ash preserved the town as a snapshot in time, and protected it from deterioration in many forms, including weather and vandalism. Now, fully excavated, you can see the ruins of family villas, ancient temples, mosaics, roads, and bathhouses.

Fall under the spell of the powerful Medici family on your guided walking tour of Florence. The Medici's dominated politics, banking and trade for generations in Florence, the capital of Tuscany. See Giotto's Bell Tower and the imposing marble cathedral of the Duomo, the Cathedral that rises far above this city's otherwise low skyline. Stand before Ghiberti's legendary *Gates of Paradise* and pass the classical statues in the main square: Piazza della Signoria. Here you can see where Michelangelo's *David* originally stood.

Welcome to the French Riviera, land of deep blue waters waving palm trees and sun-drenched promenades. Learn why this area of France is a favored resort of the rich and famous, locals and visitors alike.

Day 6: French Riviera | Pisa | Florence

6:00am: Wake-up call

Journey to Pisa and visit the Field of Miracles for a photo-stop. Here you will see the six stories of white marble that form the 12th-century Leaning Tower of Pisa, along with the adjacent marble cathedral, and the neighboring baptistery. From here, continue south to Florence, birthplace of the Renaissance.

12:00pm: Time for lunch in small, supervised groups

With the support of the Tour Director, the Group Leader will determine boundaries of where groups can go during this time.

2:00pm: Visit the Pisa Cathedral and Baptistry

Italy's largest baptistery, the Battistero di San Giovanni is also slightly taller than the Leaning Tower across the square. As it shares the same unstable ground as the tower, the baptistery also has a slight lean of 0.6 degrees towards the cathedral. The baptistery's pulpit is a masterpiece carved in 1255-60 by Nicola Pisano. Begun in 1093, Pisa Cathedral (Duomo di Pisa) is a masterpiece of Romanesque architecture. Despite its proximity to the eye-catching and tourist-attracting Leaning Tower, the Duomo still dominates the monumental Piazza dei Miracoli.

5:00pm: Arrive at the hotel in Florence

Welcome to Florence, a jewel set deep in the heart of Tuscany. Florence is the birthplace of the Italian language, opera and the Renaissance, and where works of art like Michelangelo's statue of *David* and Botticelli's *The Birth of Venus* still reside today.

6:00pm: Group dinner at the hotel in Florence

9:00pm: Group Leaders and Chaperone team will facilitate room checks and lights out

Day 7: Florence

6:00am: Wake-up call

7:00am: Breakfast at the hotel

8:00am: Travel by private motorcoach to central Florence

Day 1: Fly overnight to Paris

Day 2: Paris

Morning: Arrive in Paris and meet your Tour Director at the airport

Welcome to Paris, the cosmopolitan City of Light. While visiting, learn why Paris has grown to become the undisputed center of France, and one of the world's most important cities both culturally and politically.

12:00pm: Time for lunch in small, supervised groups

With the support of the Tour Director, the Group Leader will determine boundaries of where groups can go during this time.

2:00pm: Walking tour of Paris

Join your Tour Director on a walking tour that will introduce you to Paris. Together, you might see the chic, boutique-filled Opéra district, city's largest square at the Place de la Concorde, and the geometric Tuileries gardens.

3:00pm: See Notre-Dame Cathedral

Built between 1163 and 1361 over the remains of an ancient Roman temple, it was here that Napoleon crowned himself emperor in 1804. Victor Hugo once described the sculptured façade of Notre Dame as "a vast symphony in stone." However, had it not been for the creation of his famous hunchback, Quasimodo, the cathedral might never have returned to its former glory. Hugo's novel *The Hunchback of Notre-Dame* helped inspire a 23-year restoration of the cathedral that began in 1841.

5:00pm: Group dinner at a restaurant in central Paris

7:00pm: Travel by private motorcoach to the hotel in Paris

9:00pm: Group Leaders and Chaperone team will facilitate room checks and lights out

Day 3: Paris

6:00am: Wake-up call

7:00am: Breakfast at the hotel

8:00am: Transfer from the hotel to central Paris

10:00am: Guided sightseeing of Paris

Discover the city on the Seine during your panoramic bus tour. An expert local guide will accompany you as you drive through Paris' lively Latin Quarter. Nearby, see Notre-Dame Cathedral, standing tall at the center of the city. You will also drive down the elegant, tree-lined Champs-Élysées. Finally, be sure to snap a photo at the magnificent Eiffel Tower, an unmistakable and controversial symbol of Paris since its appearance at the 1889 World's Fair.

12:00pm: Time for lunch in small, supervised groups

With the support of the Tour Director, the Group Leader will determine boundaries of where groups can go during this time.

2:00pm: Optional Activity – Guided Excursion to Versailles

Step back into le grand siècle as you experience the opulence of Versailles, the elaborate palace of Louis XIV. Built to be the envy of all Europe, France's most extravagant château continually threatened to bankrupt the national treasury. Here the Sun King held court in the most lavish style imaginable. At one point, 1,000 nobles were attended by 4,000 servants inside the palace, while 15,000 soldiers and servants inhabited the annexes. You'll also tour the State Apartments of the King himself and walk through the historic Hall of Mirrors, where France, Spain and England officially recognized the independence of the United States in 1783, and where the Treaty of Versailles, which ended WWI, was signed. You'll also witness the ornate decor of the Queen's State Apartments, furnished for Marie Antoinette. After your visit inside the palace, be sure to take some time to stroll through the elaborate gardens, designed by André Le Nôtre. Because of the extreme popularity of Versailles, guided visits of the interior cannot be guaranteed during peak seasons. In this case, your group will hear a presentation from your guide before entering the palace.

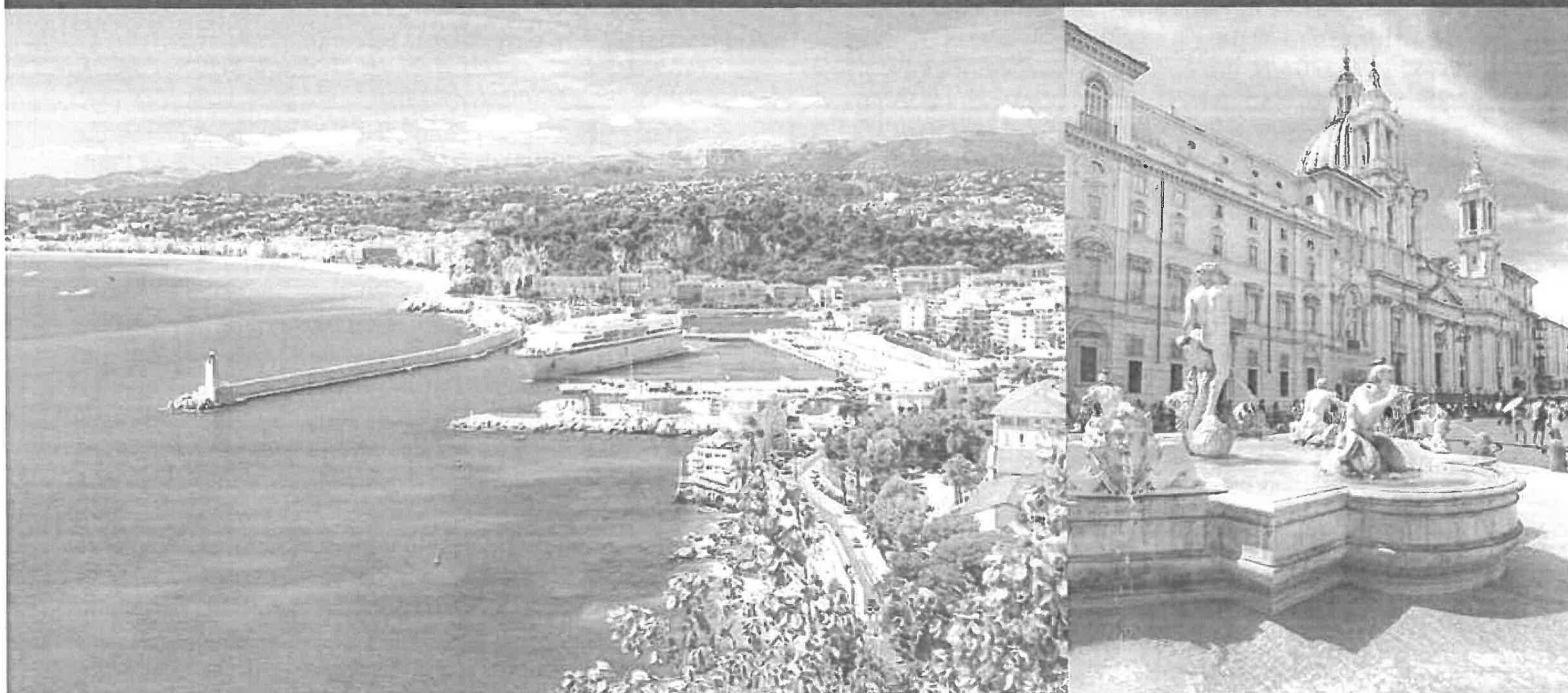

10:00am: Visit the Louvre

The Palais du Louvre, built to defend the city in the 13th century, now safeguards one of the world's greatest art collections. Enter the museum through world-renowned architect I.M. Pei's 1989 modernist glass pyramid. Inside, discover priceless antiquities from Egypt, Greece, Italy and Asia such as the statues of *Venus de Milo* and *Nike of Samothrace*, better known as *Winged Victory*. You'll also see some of the Louvre's most prized paintings by Renaissance and European masters, including Leonardo da Vinci's painting of the mysterious *Mona*
