1. 2023-2024 School Fees

The Board approved next years school fees. There are minor increases in a few areas, primarily for field trips, extracurricular sports/tournaments, as a result of inflation. Activity, travel and sports fees are updated throughout the year, as projecting costs can be challenging for certain activities. Fees for courses and options will be fixed. We don't want cost to be a barrier for students to access an activity, option, course, travel or sports program that has fees associated. Families can speak with school staff or the principal about applying for financial relief, or they can access the fee waiver form on our website. Completed fee waiver forms can be submitted to the principal.

3. International Off-Site Activity - Japan Exchange

The Board approved, in principle, an international off site activity for students from MHHS and CHHS, represented by Glen Mori, to travel to Japan for a student exchange from July 19 - August 3, 2024.

4. International Off-Site Activity - Spain & Portugal Band Trip

The Board approved, in principle, an international off site activity for students from the MHHS band program, represented by Teague Bates, to travel to Spain/Portugal from March 29 - April 7, 2024.

PRESENTATION

1. Our Collective Journey (OCJ)

The partnership between OCJ and MHPSD is made possible by AB Education Grant funding - Enhanced Mental Health Continuum of Supports and Services in Schools. A pilot project was created, bringing recovery coaches (RCs) into middle and high schools, adding to existing supports for mental health and wellness. The goal of having RCs in schools is to create a connection, instill a feeling of hope and build resiliency, to support a healthy future for youth. The message delivered by RCs resonates with a variety of people, helping students feel like they are not alone when they can see that someone else has experienced something similar.

Over the past three months, RCs presented to 863 students and worked with staff to improve their understanding of the impact of addictions. During presentations, over 500 students were surveyed:

- 54% agreed that they know someone, or have personally had challenges with addictions and mental health
- · 71% shared willingness to engage with a RC
- 33 students returned to speak with a coach for a second time, to seek more information or connection to resources
