4. Adoption of Minutes (Chair)

Michelle Millington, Division Council Chair, presented the Minutes of the Division Council of School Councils' meeting held on <u>December 12, 2024</u> for adoption. A motion was made by Gicela Cardona to adopt the minutes, second by Karen Saffran; all in favor.

5. Presentation – School Councils vs. Fundraising Associations

Bailey O'Reilly, Director of Finance, presented information to the group on the differences between School Council and Fundraising Associations.

The main purpose of a School Council is to support and enhance student learning through collaboration with the principal and school board on matters related to the operations of the school. School Councils can raise funds through non-gaming activities but are not a legal entity.

Fundraising Associations are incorporated societies, meaning they are legal entities and can obtain a gaming license for raffles, bingos and casinos.

Presentation: School Councils vs. Fundraising Associations

The discussion among the group was that some schools have members of council that are also members of the society and sometimes there are parents that attend society meetings and not the school council meetings. Parent engagement is an ongoing challenge.

6. Kindergarten/Play and Learn

Joanne Stockman, Director of Learner Supports and Services, shared the background on the division Play and Learn Program. Originally the program was developed to support families with kindergarten age children. Children attend kindergarten in the morning or the afternoon, then have the option to attend the Play and Learn program to make it a full day.

MHPSD is currently working to secure a childcare license for our Play and Learn Program, effective September 2025-2026. Once licensed, the division will be able to access the Alberta government childcare affordability grant for families reducing the fees families pay.

7. CASA Classrooms

Katrina Corbett, Division Principal of Specialized Programs presented on the CASA classroom that began in February 2024. CASA classroom is an educational setting that supports students in developing resiliency by combining academic learning with mental health interventions.

Through a partnership between CASA Mental Health and MHPSD the classroom provides a structured, therapeutic environment where students build emotional regulation, coping strategies, and social skills. The goal is to empower students with the confidence and tools they need to navigate challenges, helping them transition back to their home school with the skills for successful learning and life.

- 5-month programs; semester 1-Sept to Feb and semester 2-Feb to June
- Grade 4 to 6 focus of no more than 12 students
- Focus on individual and group therapy
- access to a mental health nurse for student and family support
- The only employee from our school division is the teacher, everyone else is employed by CASA.
- Discussion on how to access CASA and what students would be a good fit.

CASA is a Provincial program, and our division was the first in the South zone to have this program.

8. Nutrition

The following policy and administrative procedure have been updated to reflect current practice. Tracy Hensel, Superintendent reviewed the updates to these documents. Cody Edwards, Associate Superintendent of Student Services, worked alongside Sarah Scahill, Health and Wellness Manager and Sonya Brown from Alberta Health Services to make the recommended changes.

In addition to these updates there will be the development of a product vendor list to promote healthy and affordable food choices. Council chairs were assured that these updates are about working towards providing healthy options for students and modeling good nutrition in our schools. (Wellness is a journey not a destination!)

Medicine Hat Public already partners with Breakfast Club of Canada and the Root Cellar to promote healthy living and healthy eating.
