### ISSP Overall Goals

- Early identification of mental health issues
- Improved school performance
- Improved physical fitness and nutrition
- Decreased anti-social behavior
- Build resilience in children and youth, improve academics and enhance pro-social behaviors







#### ISSP Project Description

- Established in 2014
- 14 ISSP schools 4 in Calgary, 10 across the province
- Joint initiative between Calgary Police
   Service, Calgary Board of Education, Calgary
   Catholic School District and the City of
   Calgary and the Calgary Police Youth
   Foundation
- Provide intensive wraparound services where students can succeed both academically and socially
- School selection based on: student count, ages, demographics (EAL, FNMI) and other student learning needs and programming

# ISSP Full Implementation looks like...

MENTAL HEALTH	The mental health professional is fully integrated into the program and actively provides services
PHYSICAL EDUCATION	30 minutes of physical education is fully integrated into the school day for all students and is provided by a PE teacher.
NUTRITION/ FOOD	All students have consistent access to breakfast, lunch, and snacks, and the service is running smoothly.
POSITIVE POLICE PRESENCE	Police presence is a consistent and positive part of the school environemnet a minimum of 6 - 8 times per year, with strong collaboration between all stakeholders.
AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMMING	Comprehensive after-school programming is consistently available at the school and is widely utilized by students.





Universally offered support demonstrating the flexibility and responsivity that ISSP offers






#### The Breakfast Club






# What do our Parents Say?
