MHHS boys and girls Wrestling teams won the Alberta Rural Provincial gold medals and then Matt Stenhouse went to the Alberta Provincials and won the gold medal in his weight category. Matt has been offered a scholarship to the University of Regina for both football and wrestling.

Congratulations to Mike Rasmusson, Community Coach for the Medicine Hat High School JV Boys' Basketball team, who was named coach of the year by the league.

4. Basketball Season

MHHS Girls' Basketball

Congratulations to the coaches and players of the Medicine Hat High School Girls' basketball team who won the provincial championship. MHHS Varsity Girls Basketball team went undefeated in 4A Zones playoffs winning gold by beating #1 ranked Cardston and #2 ranked Raymond, then went on to win the 4A Provincial Championship in the toughest draw possible - they beat the home team Jasper Place during the school day on Thursday in front of a packed gym of Jasper Place students, then they beat the #1, #2, and #3 ranked teams to win Gold. The top 16 teams go to provincials and they played the toughest 4. They went in ranked #10. The team's efforts throughout the playoffs were outstanding and their hard work and dedication were rewarded.

Thank you to MHHS staff for their support with donations to pay for the girls' meal prior to the big game. The support of everyone at the school for the team was greatly appreciated.

Crescent Heights High School

a) This year's CHHS Viking Varsity girls had one of the best years in the last number of years. The year started out very slowly because of some injuries to key players and just not being very healthy as a team. As the year went on, the girls fought through the adversities and became

a very competitive team in both league and tournament play.

They entered into seven tournaments and ended up being finalists in six and beating a lot of very good schools. They were ranked as honourable mention at the beginning of the year and ended up ranked 5th in the province. The team beat other city schools on a regular basis in league play and won the SEBC League banner for the first time since 1997.

They attended zones to compete with six other teams that were ranked in the top ten in the province that were in their zone. They won their first game, but lost to the eventual provincial winners.

Overall it was a tremendous year for the Girls' Viking Basketball Program and for CHHS.

- b) Vikings Boys' Basketball - The 2014-15 season for the Vikings was an important rebuilding year. The focus for this year was about player development and creating a culture that will inspire others in the school to become involved in Viking athletics. The team was led by captains Zack Wilson and Justin Nordlee, both playing in their final year. The Vikings were placed into top tournaments in the province including the District 4 Tournament in Calgary and the Super South Tournament in Medicine Hat, arguably the biggest tournaments in Alberta. While the Vikings overall record may not appear glamorous, the players developed in skill and determination. A core of young players, including Rylly Quirante, Adrian Glauser & Alex Glauser, will be looked upon to lead the Vikings next season. Coach Hamilton was extremely proud of how his team managed to overcome obstacles and remain a team that followed the motto Family, Academics, Basketball. The Vikings lost their semi-final zone play-off game to eventual champions W.R. Myers (Taber), but are ready to challenge for the zone title next vear.
- c) The boys and girls junior high teams all had successful years. There were a total of six teams, with approximately 65 players in the program, between the boys and girls teams. The grade 9 teams both improved significantly over the course of the season. The girls team attended 4J zones in Raymond and achieved their goal of defeating a higher seeded team in the tournament. The younger teams were very strong this season. Both boys and

girls grade 7/8 teams captured their respective 'B' league championships. Most of the players on the grade 7 boys and girls teams had their first basketball experience this year. Much like the grade 9 teams, they did not win the championship, but their knowledge and skills improved considerably from the beginning of the season to the end as they started to learn the game.

Dr. Roy Wilson Learning Centre

- The Grade 7 "B" boys' basketball team had a a) very successful first season at the Dr. Roy Wilson Learning Centre. Their skill development and knowledge of the game of basketball grew tremendously as the season progressed leading to a third place finish at the CHHS tournament. The boys worked hard all season long to create a "never quit" identity with a mindset that no lead is too large to overcome. Their unselfish personalities led to plenty of exciting games that resulted in a handful of victories. These 20+ student athletes pushed each other every day in practice to become the best players that they could be, demonstrating what it takes to be a true T.E.A.M. (Together Everyone Achieves More). Congratulations boys!
- The Wilson Royals girls' basketball team had a b) successful first season! Every day the girls worked hard in practice to become better athletes. They focused on the skills of shooting, passing, dribbling, defense, and becoming a good teammate. The girls made it a goal to support their teammates on and off the court. As a team they practiced the agreements, and worked hard to always put their best effort forward in all situations. The girls' commitment and hard work lead them to many victories in both tournaments and league play. We are very proud of all of the athletes that participated in the Wilson Royals Basketball Program and we are very excited to see them grow as athletes in the years to come!

Medicine Hat Christian School

a) <u>Warriors Girls' Basketball</u>

The MHCS girls' basketball team was a young team who improved throughout the season. For tournaments, MHCS competed in the "B" level and were successful at this level. We are hoping to host and challenge for Zones next season. As usual, we are always eager to get going and next season will be the same. V. PRESENTATIONS

1. <u>Outreach Programs</u>

Ms. Gust provided an overview of the five Outreach Programs being offered in the District. These programs are designed to support individual student programming needs resulting in increased student engagement and success. Community partnerships also play an integral part in the success of the programs.

Ms. Peterson provided an overview of the Central High Program and the work being done with Chromebooks and Google classroom.

2. <u>District Initiative</u>

The District continues work around improved learning through enhanced instruction. An overview was provided regarding the process of developing a District consensus about what the District focus will be over the next 3 years. Parameters were set to guide the conversation and dialogue around the decision regarding this focus. In moving forward, consideration will be given to a

common language and building a culture of collaborative learning, job embedded ongoing PD, while building on past learning.

The District met with ATA reps on March 31st and also distributed a survey to teachers in April to determine a consensus regarding the next focus for the District. The survey listed potential focus topics and the results indicated that 79% of the teachers surveyed chose Assessment as the preferred focus for the next 3 years.

The next steps will be to form a committee to implement this initiative.

3. Chromebook Pilot Update

The District has initiated a Chromebook pilot at Connaught School, Crescent Heights High School and the Dr. Roy Wilson Learning Centre this year. Nadia Delanoy, Terry Freeman, Todd Samuelson and Michelle Hilton were in attendance to share an update.

The results of a recent survey that was given to 265 students and 10 teachers at the secondary level, and 150 students and 15 teachers at the elementary level, indicated a high level of support for Chromebooks in the classroom.
