The Medicine Hat Public School Division Infrastructure Maintenance and Renewal Program Expenditure Plan for the program year 2019-2020 was presented for information. The projected costs of the IMR projects for 2019-2020 are \$3,499,368.

Alberta Education is providing capital funding of \$2,312,670 under the 2019-2020 Infrastructure Maintenance and Renewal (IMR) program. At present, the Division has \$1,186,698 of unutilized carry over of IMR funds from the previous year.
