Families and their children/students have identified spiritual, faith-based needs as a priority in their learning and everyday lives. As a faith based alternative program, our Bible course offers the knowledge, perspective and skills that help students grow as Christian leaders in our community (home, school, church).

**Scope and Sequence:** Describe the essential understandings – big ideas that endure over time and are of value to self, society and the subject – for this course sequence.

The following progression is used:

K – Who Jesus is and the Creation story

- 1- Life of Jesus and God's relationship with the Israelites
- 2- Genesis, Exodus and the promise of a Messiah
- 3- The promised land (God's fulfillment of a promise), Judges sent to help and guide, Old Testament connections to Jesus
- 4- David and the line of David, Wisdom (Proverbs), Israel's exile
- 5- Jesus's life (connections through the Gospels), and Holy Spirit
- 6- Followers of Jesus with connection to the modern Church
- 7- Developing a personal faith through prayer and devotions, and church history
- 8- Leadership in the Bible, the gift of mercy and grace
- 9- Biblical view to everyday questions, Christian World View and World Religions, and personal reflection on faith.

Within the course, students will be exposed to other worldviews and religious perspectives. This also connects with the social studies curriculum.

**Guiding Questions and Learning Outcomes:** Describe unifying concepts embedded within learning outcomes and contextualize that knowledge for deeper understanding.

Some of the unifying concepts are:

Overall Biblical story, relation of New Testament to Old Testament, connection of the bigger picture of God's story (Bible) to Jesus life and role as Saviour. Another concept is the personalization of faith as students mature and make meaning for themselves.
