1. Family School Liaison Workers

Family School Liaison Workers (FSLWs) play an important role as part of the school-based team to ensure that social and emotional needs of students are met within the context of an inclusive educational system. FSLWs become the link that connects school, home and community to ensure a coordinated and comprehensive approach to student wellness. By nurturing positive and productive relationships, FSLWs support student learning and success using a strength-based

approach. Working together as a team, FSLWs provide a responsive network of support that is individualized for each student. The result is a flexible, responsive, and evolving system of support that assists students in reaching their full potential as learners. The goal of this presentation is to highlight the ways in which our FSLW team supports students through a therapeutic lens, a whole school approach to inclusion and via collaborative community partnerships.

The attending FSLWs shared the strategies they use to build trust and open communication lines with our students. As talk therapy is not always effective with younger children, staff will often engage students in game play, reading, and art therapy to connect and build relationships. With older students, providing a safe space to have lunch or talk on a flexible schedule has helped to break down barriers. Meeting students where they are at and creating "in the moment" supports is very important for this age group. Small groups of students with similar needs like social skills, conflict resolution or friendship will work together as needed. FSLWs also work with many other community resources to provide wrap around support.
