

ALBERTA ASSURANCE SURVEY SUMMARIES

BACKGROUND

The Alberta Education assurance survey replaced the accountability pillar surveys in 2022. Many of the measures overlap with the previous survey and some measures are new (indicated in the summaries). Surveys were administered to: students in grades four, seven and ten; students in grades four through nine (small schools);

parents of students in grades four, seven and ten; and all teachers.

Each year, these results are used by schools and the school division to develop our assurance plans and school goals found on each school's website.

Commentary and Analysis: This is our second year with the new AEA measures and our third time reporting on a school year that was impacted by the pandemic. This convergence creates some gaps in our data and has altered the typical patterns we have in providing commentary and analysis on our results. This will be reflected throughout this report. As can be noted in the above overall summary chart, some of our key indicators in terms of achievement are missing and some of our learning supports data is too new to be able to note patterns. We can note that in the measure categories, consistency is a word that would describe our results. We held steady in areas of high school completion which was important because we made considerable gains in the last two years in this area. To hold onto that growth was an achievement.

Commentary and Analysis: Any of our measures that have the slightest connection to mental health and well-being are closely monitored. The citizenship measure, while having "high" current achievement actually represents a decline for our system. This is even more substantial within the student perspective. The disconnect that was created during the pandemic is starting to manifest itself within our results. To this end, our Education Plan prioritizes "Wellness" and is full of system and school-based strategies to support improvement in this measure.

Commentary and Analysis: A continued celebration for our high schools. The improvements we have seen in completion rates over the last couple of year have been maintained and in some cases improved upon. We suspect that the pandemic has influenced this in a positive way – more students sticking with school through to completion. At the same time, our high schools have implemented multiple new checks and balances to support students staying on the path to graduation.

Commentary and Analysis: The adults in our community believe that we have been able to maintain a quality level of education within our schools. Our students have a slightly different perspective and provide evidence that the disconnectedness of the last couple of years is impacting them. The two key items that jump out are around engagement and purpose. A number of students feeling that school is not as interesting as they once did and some students struggling to make the connecting between core subjects and real-world benefit. Our ability to deliver in person learning combined with a system focus on teacher clarity and learning intentions will help to mitigate the first factor; helping to make the connection to real-world benefits will be an item we will need to strategize about.

Commentary and Analysis: The data in this result is interesting in that the parent perception of their involvement was maintained, however the teacher perception of parent involvement declined. Obvious changes to school routines have impacted this and intentional planning around the "re-introduction" of people to school buildings should mitigate some of this. Many school leaders have set as their professional inquiry a desire to positive impact school community though the intentional increased involvement of parents.
