# 3. <u>Early Learning Update</u>

This year MHSD 76 will bring together Early Learning, Kindergarten, Grade one teachers and Elementary Principals to gain a common understanding of the continuum within the Kindergarten/Grade One curriculum with a focus specifically on Language Arts and Mathematics. A committee has been formed to explore best practices and develop district goals.

The District currently has 11 early learning classrooms in 9 schools and offers District support within 22 private preschools and child care centers, serving children from  $2\frac{1}{2}$  to 6 years of age.
