POLICY UPDATES

Policy 634: Banned Substances

The possession and/or use of banned substances/paraphernalia on school grounds, in school buildings and facilities, on school property or at school-related or sponsored events *is a health*, *safety, and environmental hazard*.

No students, staff or visitors are permitted to use banned substances at any time, including non school hours:

- in a building, facility, or vehicle owned, leased, rented or chartered by the MHPSD;
- on school grounds/property (including athletic fields & parking lots owned, leased, rented or chartered by MHPSD);
- at any school-sponsored or school-related event on-campus or off-campus.

PRESENTATIONS

Herald School leaders shared strategies to develop a positive school culture and advance strength in literacy.
