5. Nutrition Presentation

Tracey Hensel, Associate Superintendent of Student Services introduced Sarah Scahill, Health & Wellness Manager for the Division and Desirea Agar, Health Promotion

Coordinator for Alberta Health Services. These 3 ladies work with our School Comprehensive Health Teams. March is nutrition month, so this presentation was focused on the relationship between nutrition and academic achievement.

- Food, mood, learning;
- breakfast improves short term cognition, math scores, memory and creativity, physical endurance;
- nutrition can affect the ability to learn and academic success (attentiveness, absenteeism, tardiness, hyperactivity, aggression, social withdrawal, social skills).

Tracy Hensel spoke of Division policy [642 – Healthy Nutritional Choices](#) which outlines that nutritious foods should be the primary choices available in schools. It is important that we model good food choices.

Nutrition funds from Alberta Education combined with support from the Breakfast Club of Canada and the Root Cellar help our students access breakfast and lunch programs.

Desirea Agar shared some survey results on Special Lunch Purchasing Factors that included MHPSD and other school Divisions on how to offer healthier food choices in schools.

Discussion included: ensuring parents are aware of the nutrition program operating in our schools, the importance of not limiting access to the program, and enthusiasm to have parent volunteers back in schools to assist in food preparation.

Mark Davidson introduced the working committee of teachers for this project: Georgia Bull, Ricky Hildebrand and Jen Karpiuk. This trio presented their process and work completed to develop a Student Senate.

The selection of students, grades 10 to 12, would be either recommended by staff or by self-nomination with a focus on ensuring proper representation of the student body. The school-based senates would collect information from the student body to share with the Board as well as provide feedback to the Board as requested.

Discussion included possible mentorship from the Board, proper preparation for Board Meetings and concerns on participation.

The Board is looking forward to having student input and promoting student leadership roles. Policy 200: Role of The Board of Trustees will be updated to include seeking student representation from schools.

Engagement Grant

School Councils received a \$500 grant from Alberta Education to increase parent engagement.

Jennifer Kerslake, Director of Community Engagement for the Medicine Hat College, joined the meeting to present to the group on opportunities that could come from partnering with the Beej Project (Brandon Niwa Legacy Fund).

Budget

Mark Davidson, Superintendent, provided an overview to the group on potential grants and funding, however, no details will be confirmed until end of March. There is expected to be some increases to grants: 4.6% transportation, 1% operations, 1% infrastructure and renewal.

- It was announced that school jurisdictions that lost enrollment will be 'held harmless' (provided the same funding as 2019/2020 enrollment).
- MHPSD will not receive the 1% increases as this would surpass the amount we receive under 'hold harmless'.
- Funding will be provided for the roll out of the new curriculum, over 3-year period.
- An expected \$300,000 in support of well-being.
- ATA and TEBA are currently negotiating central and local table items which could impact reserves / budget.
- Board operating reserves are at about 3%, which is about 3-month operating costs.

Budget planning is difficult until we receive specifics from government.

Reminder to parents that registration is now available for 2022-2023 school year. This provides us with important guidance to properly staff our schools. A natural decline in enrollment is expected this year.
