1. International Trip – New York City, New York

18, 2023. Teacher and trip organizer Jennifer Davies presented to the Board on their experiences and educational highlights.

Ms. Davies shared that students on the trip attend professional workshops through the Broadway Student Summit and four live theatre productions. During their free time they visited many significant landmarks, toured different neighborhoods and enjoyed a variety of foods. Jennifer shared that the whole trip was fundraised by students and families.

The board praised Jennifer and her students for their passion and enthusiasm in addition to all the work put into these trips.

2. <u>Early Childhood Services / MHPSD Service</u> <u>Delivery</u>

Medicine Hat Public School Division offers a robust early learning program in our schools and in our community. We heard from the team about what early intervention looks like in action.

The program focuses on developing speech, language, social skills, communication, gross and fine motor control as well as helping children regulate emotions, problem solve, navigate transitions/routines and build physical literacy. This is achieved through play, building, pretending, getting messy, moving and exploring. Team members shared stories and videos around the growth in students engaged in the program.

IX. RECOGNITION/ACCOMPLISHMENTS

1. <u>KisKihkeyimowin</u>

MHPSD hosted KisKihkeyimowin, pronounced (geese - kih - kay - mo - in) which is a Plains Cree word meaning "sharing good teachings". Grade 4 and 10 students from MHPSD learned about Blackfoot, Cree and Métis cultures and teachings in traditional Tipis. The event was held in partnership with the Medicine Hat College and the Miyasin Friendship Centre.

KisKihkeyimowin created an opportunity for students to connect with Blackfoot, Cree and Métis cultures and gain a deeper understanding and respect through age-appropriate stories and rich hands-on teachings. Students participated in the circle of courage, medicine wheel, hide story, beading, drumming, wood flute, finger weaving, making dream catchers, learning traditional dances & games, Tipi raising, talking circle, smudging, and listening to traditional story telling. Presenters include Indigenous leaders, Elders, knowledge keepers and other valued members of the Indigenous community. The event aimed to promote better understanding and appreciation of Indigenous culture within our community as we actively take steps toward Truth and Reconciliation.

The event was several years in the making with initial planning being put on hold due to COVID. The work done by Corey Sadlemyer, Cody Edwards, Lee Krasilowez as well as our FNMI team and community partners made this event a great success.

X. ITEMS FOR ACTION

1. Budget 2023-24 Spring Release

As per the Education Act the Board is presented in May with a budget proposal for the upcoming school year. The Spring Release is built on best estimates available at the time. An update will be provided in the fall on actual student numbers.

It should be noted that the budget is in a deficit position for 2023-24 fiscal year. This budget is presented to the Board for consideration and approval.

An ongoing downward trend in enrollment in combination with the loss of hold harmless and transition funding has resulted in a reduction of teaching staff. Despite the loss of 22 teaching positions (through completion of temporary contracts, retirements and resignations), the division will be maintaining current classroom ratios. The deficit of 2.29 million will be addressed through a reduction to Capital Reserves (1.2M) and use of

Operating Reserves (savings from 2022-23 - 1.08M) with ministerial approval.
