What Are CASA Classrooms?

• In partnership with the **Government of Alberta**, **community partners**, and **school divisions**, CASA Mental Health delivers **mental health care** in classrooms.

• CASA Classrooms providing care closer to where students learn. 5 month program located at Southview School. (Semester 1 September - February, Semester 2 February - June)

 The goal is to help children stabilize, build skills, and successfully transition back to their community school. Home school transition opportunities according to child's

How CASA Classrooms Support Students:

A Focus on Mental Health and Learning



• **Integrated mental health support** with a team including therapists, mental health professionals, and teacher.

• Small group classroom settings to offer individualized attention and support.

• Focus on emotional regulation, coping strategies, and social-emotional learning.

Collaboration with families to support long-term success at home and in school.



A Day in the Life of a CASA Student

• Therapeutic interventions provided during the school day.

- Academic learning tailored to each student's readiness and abilities.
- Group activities to practice social skills and relationship-building.

• Opportunities for play, movement, and creative expression to support mental wellness.

• Regular check-ins with families to discuss progress and strategies.

Working Together for Your Child's Success



- **Family involvement** is key! CASA **collaborates** with parents and caregivers every step of the way. Weekly caregiver meetings.
- Regular CASA team meetings to review progress and adjust plans as needed.
- Support for a **smooth transition** back to your child's home school.
- Together, we build the **skills**, **confidence**, and **resilience** your child needs to thrive.
