1. CHHS Theatre Arts Students Travel to New York

Students in the CHHS Theatre Arts Program travelled to New York City for an 8 day educational adventure with their teacher Jennifer Davies. Walking 30,000 steps per day, students attended 4 Broadway performances, visited local landmarks, tasted incredible foods and much more. Students learned from North Americas most talented performers, explored diverse hands on learning opportunities and collaborated with youth from across the world, participating in the Broadway Student Summit at Pearl Studios. **Fun fact:** The last time the theatre arts program went to New York was in 2018 and half of the students from that trip have now pursued an education in theatre arts.

2. Early Literacy Framework

Members of the Dr Roy Wilson Learning Centre early literacy team (the director, teachers, an EA, admin, occupational therapist, physio therapist and speech/language therapist) presented on the framework in action. Early intervention through play based learning is offered through the early learning program, kindergarten, and play & learn. The framework focuses on developing a child's language, social skills, communication, gross and fine motor control, as well and helping to regulate emotions, problem solve, navigate transitions/routines and build physical literacy. The early learning framework develops future learners through play, by building, pretending, getting messy, moving and exploring.

MHPSD hosted Kiskihkeyimowin, which is a Plains Cree meaning "sharing good teachings". Grade 4 and 10 students learned through Blackfoot, Cree and Métis teachings in traditional Tipis. The event was held in partnership with the Medicine Hat College and Miywasin Friendship Centre. Special thanks to sponsors Methanex, South Country Co-op, Cancarb, Southland Transportation and Saamis. Students gained an understanding through age appropriate stories and hands on teachings, such as circle of courage, medicine wheel, hide story, beading, drumming, wood flute, finger weaving, making dream catchers, learning traditional dances & games, Tipi raising, talking circle and smudging. Presenters included Elder Charlie Fox and other valued leaders in the Indigenous community. The event aimed to promote understanding and appreciation of Indigenous culture in our community as we actively take steps toward Truth and Reconciliation.
